The architectural redesign of the window/door combination to tall narrow French doors balances the high ceiling and draws the eye back to the custom fireplace.

Elegant full-length drapery panels mounted high above the windows add color and soften the huge expanse of windows. The custom panels were designed to allow the maximum amount of light to flood into the room. The simple design frames the windows while drawing your eye outdoors to the fabulous view.

Color is added to the space by layering in the finishing touches. The colorful painting over the fireplace mixes beautifully with the artisan glass lighting and custom area rug. Golden-hued accessories and art glass complete the setting.

Near the windows, elegant wood-frame accent chairs like these feature a large-scale lattice pattern, funky canary yellow leopard print pillows and a dramatic espresso finish.
